

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

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


Lush Lash 2, 1970, acrylic on metallic foil, edition of 50, 13 x 11 inches



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





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Airea D. Matthews

Airea D. Matthews' first collection of poems is the critically acclaimed Simulacra, which received the prestigious 2016 Yale Series of Younger Poets Award. Matthews is also the author of Bread and Circus (Simon and Schuster, 2023), a memoir-in-verse that combines poetry, prose, and imagery to explore the realities of economic necessity, marginal poverty, and commodification, through a personal lens. Matthews received a 2020 Pew Fellowship, a 2016 Rona Jaffe Foundation Writers' Award, and was awarded the Louis Untermeyer Scholarship in Poetry from the 2016 Bread Loaf Writers' Conference. Matthews earned her MFA from the Helen Zell Writers' Program at the University of Michigan. In 2022, she was named Philadelphia's Poet Laureate. She is an assistant professor at Bryn Mawr College where she directs the poetry program.













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


Sound Bursts: Aiwen Zhang and Valentin Kovalev

Aiwen Zhang, saxophonist, born in China, came to study in the United States in 2020. Zhang accomplished the specialist degree at the University of Michigan School of

Music, Theatre and Dance under the direction of Dr. Timothy McAllister. She holds degrees from the Paris Conservatory and the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York. Her primary saxophone teachers have included Timothy McAllister, Claude Delangle,

Chien-Kwan Lin and John Sampen. Zhang has performed across North America, Europe and Asia and has shared solo and chamber music performances at venues including the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, Lincoln Center in New York City, Beijing



National Centre for the Performing Arts, Prince Mahidol Hall in Bangkok, Université Européenne de Saxophone, Shanghai Concert Hall, Zhejiang Concert Hall, Conservatoire National Supérieur de Musique et de Danse de Paris and Shandong University of Arts. She has been a featured soloist with orchestras including the Thailand Philharmonic Orchestra and Zhejiang Symphony Orchestra. Aiwen Zhang has been a prize-winner at prestigious music competitions including the 5th Jean-Marie LONDEIX International Saxophone (JMLISC) Competition, the Prix de Conservatoire National Supérieur de Musique et de Danse de Paris, the Vandoren Emerging Artist Competition and the Lima Symphony Young Artist Competition.

Classical saxophonist Valentin Kovalev is the first Russian saxophonist to enter the Paris Conservatory as an undergraduate and to be admitted to the graduate program at the University of Michigan. He has received awards from several foundations in France and Russia, including the Mstislav Rostropovich Foundation and the Fondation Marcel Bleustein-Blanchet pour la vocation. As a soloist, he has performed with several major symphony orchestras, including the New Russia Orchestra, the Orchestra of Galina Vishnevskaya Opera Center and the Tchaikovsky Big Symphony Orchestra. Among Mr. Kovalev's many prizes at international competitions is the MTNA Young Artist Woodwind Competition (2021), University of Michigan Concerto Competition (2021), and unanimous First Prize in the Online Saxiana International Competition (2021), He participated in a tour of 9 cities in China in 2019 with Saxophone Quartet, "Trioton." Together with the Rostropovich Foundation and the Russian Seasons, Mr. Kovalev has participated in concert tours since 2016 in Germany, France, Luxembourg, and Belgium. Valentin began his education in Barnaul, Russia and obtained his Bachelor's degree at the Paris Conservatory with Claude Delangle. He is currently pursuing a graduate degree with Timothy McAllister at the University of Michigan. Mr. Kovalev is an artist of Henri SelmerParis, and is an Astral artist.

Mezzo-soprano Chrystal E. Williams continues her robust career on both sides of the Atlantic in both opera and oratorio. During the 2019-20 season Ms. Williams made a number of debuts, including the Metropolitan Opera as Maketaten in Philip Glass' Akhnaten, The Stewardess in Jonathan Dove's Flight, and Rebecca Parker in Charlie Parker's Yardbird with Seattle Opera, a reprise of the role she created. She returned to Birmingham Opera Company UK for a role debut as Katerina in Shostokovich's Lady Macbeth of Mtsensk. Ms. Williams has been heard in concerts with the Norrköping Symphony Orchestra in Sweden and debuted with Washington National Opera as Elizabeth Keckley/Coretta Scott King in Philip Glass's Appomattox. The Chrystal E. Williams Scholarship was founded by the artist in 2004 to help students pursue a career in the Performing Arts. She is a graduate of the Academy of Vocal Arts in Philadelphia, PA where she earned her Artist Diploma in Opera Performance. She received her Master of Music in Opera Performance from Yale University School of Music in 2010, and her Bachelor of Fine Arts in Voice Performance from Carnegie Mellon University in 2008.



Accordionist Felipe Hostins has been thrilling audiences for over fifteen years with his 'soulful' and 'groovy' playing. He

began music studies at the age of three with his paternal grandfather, Valmor Hostins. He later joined the School of Music Amormega (Middle Garcia Neighborhood Association), in his hometown of Blumenau, Santa Catarina (SC) where he studied music theory of the accordion for 4 years. Hostins moved to the US in 2015 and thus began his international career. Hostins is a natural composer and currently finishing his first original album, *Origins*, with collaborations of artists around the globe. He co-created the musical style Forrópera with mezzo-soprano, Chrystal E. Williams. Forrópera is a musical space created as a way to foster unity, peace and understanding through music. Hostins is part of the Gadji Accordion Team and was featured at both the Festival Internacional de acordeões de Setúbal and the Festival Internacional de Acordeões de Algarve, both in 2018. He was a featured artist in the inaugural Brazilian Accordion Panorama Festival 2021.



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Play On Philly (POP) provides high-quality music education to students, who would typically lack access, as a vehicle for life skills and academic achievement. During a typical year, we provide 2 hours of music instruction and ensemble practice every day after school and over 25 performance opportunities throughout the year. Students range from pre-Kindergarten to 12th grade and are loaned an orchestral instrument at no cost. POP programming has proven results: our students score ten points higher on standardized tests and have improved behavior and study skills. 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
